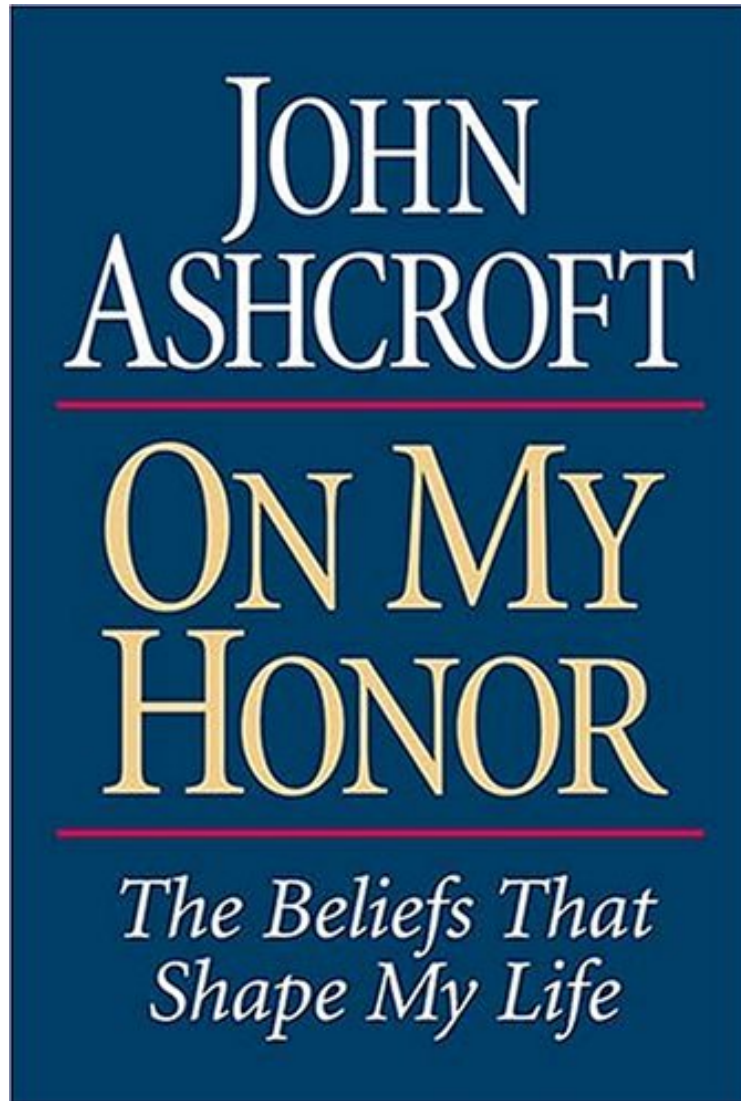

By KT While pretending to praise the ideals which he claims have shaped his life, Ashcroft transparently seeks, more diligently, to glorify himself by association with such ideals, while failing to convince the reader that he, in fact, believes they apply to his friends as well as his enemies. No real insights here, though the bit about his father making the young boy think he had caused them to nearly crash to their deaths in while learning to pilot a plane, does, perhaps, give insight into his fear-based approach to public policy. If you must buy it, get the paperback, which is overpriced at \$10.01 (plus the inevitable shipping.)

On the first day of his Senate confirmation hearings, John Ashcroft raised his right hand and vowed, "I swear to uphold the laws of the United States of America, so help me God." People who knew him intimately knew they could count on this. And so will others as they read *On My Honor*, a book that reveals Ashcroft's personal beliefs on racism, abortion, capital punishment, our judicial system, his faith in God, and more.
