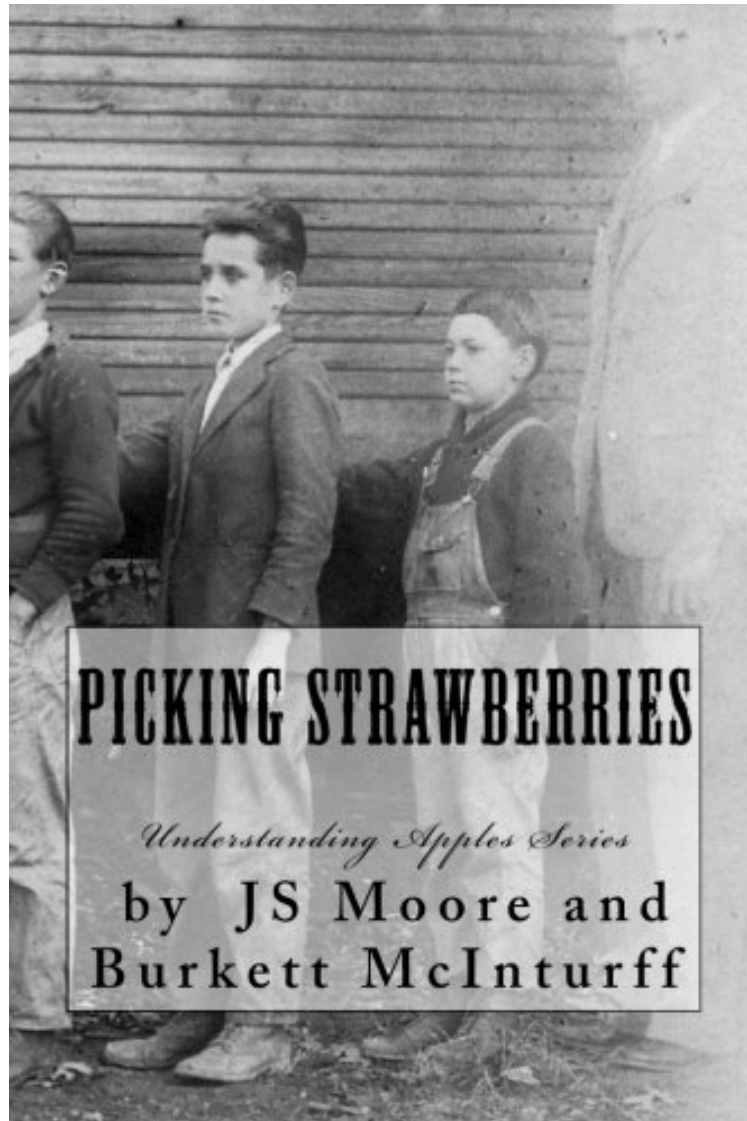

Have you ever had a chance to listen to the "war stories" of the old time trial lawyers? There is something moving about the way many of those stories are told. This book captures the emotion, the humor, and pretty much writes the stories the same way they would be told in coffee shops or bars frequented by lawyers. It also reminds some of us litigators that our own stories are the things that will connect us to jurors. And if we don't have stories of our own, perhaps Mr. McInturff's can be borrowed.
